What has been your most successful program and why?

Our work with the European union for the educational Erasmus plus programme for which we were the main provider in Britain & received many accolades. We interacted with many youth organisations in every part of Europe as well as countries that worked with the European Union such as the Balkans, Middle East & the Caucasus. Every year, for a decade, ASHA has hosted post graduate Indian girls from disadvantaged backgrounds on a three-week programme which has been acclaimed as life changing.

How has your organization's work made a difference in people's lives?

The ASHA Centre has held youth programmes for our community's young each year and have also held the first Young Leader's Forum which led to many of our young leaders taking important roles in our community worldwide. Those that attended the ASHA Centre have also made lifetime friendships and created an impact on their communities throughout the world with their action, creativity and care for others. Recently sixty young Zoroastrians attend a weekend retreat at the ASHA centre. It was the first time eight young Zoroastrian Dastoors prayed together; a moving moment of spiritual beauty. The weekend was funded by the World Zoroastrian Organisation and Zoroastrian Trust Funds of Europe. It was also the first time they had worked in collaboration for the good of our young which was wonderful. Young Zoroastrians are making an impact everywhere and we are proud of them.
